The Judges of the United States District Court for the District of Massachusetts have selected Donald L. Cabell to be a magistrate judge, subject to the required background investigation. When appointed, Mr. Cabell will sit in Boston.

Mr. Cabell began his legal career as an associate in the firms Hale and Dorr and Peckham, Lobel, Casey, Prince and Tye in Boston. In 1995, Mr. Cabell was hired as an Assistant United States Attorney. During his time with the United States Attorney's Office, he has served in the major crimes unit and anti-terrorism and national security unit. For the past two years, Mr. Cabell served as the Justice Attaché in the Office of International Affairs at the United States Embassy in Paris, France.

Chief Judge Patti B. Saris said of the selection: "Don Cabell has extensive experience as an Assistant United States Attorney. He has tried numerous cases over his approximately twenty year career as a prosecutor, and has an in-depth understanding of the proceedings in criminal cases. Prior to his career as a prosecutor, he also worked as a civil litigator in two prominent Boston law firms. We are confident of his ability to be fair, reasonable, patient and respectful in the courtroom, and we look forward to welcoming him to the court family."

Mr. Cabell was a Commonwealth Scholar at the University of Massachusetts at Amherst where he graduated with honors. He is a graduate of Northeastern University School of Law.
